

## **MD NAZMUL ISLAM, PhD**

Md. Nazmul Islam is an Assistant Professor of Political Science in the Department of Political Science and Public Administration and Head of Turkey, Asia and Indo-Pacific Studies, Institute for International Relations and Strategic Research (ULISA) at the Ankara Yildirim Beyazit University (AYBU), Ankara, Turkey. He did his Postdoc from the Faculty of Communication, Ankara University, Turkey and completed his PhD from the Department of Political Science and Public Administration, Faculty of Political Science, Ankara Yildirim Beyazit University, Ankara, Turkey. Islam is a former ERASMUS Research Fellow at Europa Institute, Saarland University, Germany, and a former Research Associate at the Joint Project between the University of Cambridge (Judge Business School), UK, and BRAC (Research and Evaluation Unit), Bangladesh. Dr. Islam is the author of several books, many book chapters, and peer-reviewed articles. He has edited *Rohingya Refugee Crisis in Myanmar* (Springer, Palgrave Macmillan, 2022), *Comparative Public Administration* (Springer, Palgrave Macmillan, 2022) and *South Asian Politics* (Ankara, 2022). His book chapters are available in a book, *Global Encyclopaedia of Public Administration, Public Policy, and Governance*, Edited by Ali Farazmand (Switzerland: Springer), one chapter in a forthcoming book on “the Routledge Handbook of Poverty in Global South” (Routledge), his publications (papers, articles, reports, and reviews) on various subjects have appeared, among others, in *Journal Contemporary Review of the Middle East* (Sage Publication), *Journal of Globalization Studies* (Scopus), *Journal of Contemporary China* (Forthcoming Article, Routledge), *Insight Turkey* (Scopus), *ADAM Journal of Social Science*, *Journal of Youth Research* (Turkish Ministry of Youth and Sports), *Cappadocia Journal of Area Studies*, *M5 Journal* (Turkish Ministry of Defense); and has more than 30 conferences proceeding including in University of Toronto, Canada, Oxford University, UK, Virginia University, USA and King College London, UK, etc.

Dr. Islam worked in different positions and projects conducted at the University of Cambridge, Saarland University, University of Trento, Greifswald University, Ankara University, OIC-SESRIC, BRAC University, BRAC, Grameen Bank-Yunus Center, UNDP, YTB and ILO. Between 2015-2018 and 2019-2020, Mr. Islam worked in the Ministry of External Affairs, India; VšĮ Inceptus Organization, Lithuania; University of Trento, Italy; University of Griefswald, Germany; Natural TV, Turkey; Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), SESRIC, Turkey; Republic of Turkey Prime Ministry, Presidency for Turks Abroad and Related Communities (YTB), Turkey; and International Labour Organization (ILO), Bangladesh as a consultant, research fellow and policy analyst.

He specializes and teaches Asia and Indo Pacific Strategy, Non-Western Soft Power Strategy, Current Issues in Politics, Current Debates in Social and Political Theory, International Security, Peace and Conflict Resolution, Religion, Politics and Comparative Public Policy. Islam’s academic work has been published in Op-eds published by the Ankara based Anadolu Agency; Istanbul based Daily Sabah; Hong Kong-based Asia Times; and New Delhi based South Asia Journal. Islam’s major areas of interest include politics, foreign policy, and administration of the South, Southeast and West Asia especially the policy and politics of China and India in the contemporary world.
