

A+ SAMPLE SCRIPT

You will listen to a dialogue between Oliver and Emily. As you listen, choose the correct answer. You will hear the dialogue twice with a fifteen-second interval. Now, you have one minute to read the questions.

Emily: Hi Oliver, how are you?

Oliver: I'm fine, Emily. I'm ready to start planning the film festival. I think the festival will be really exciting.

Emily: I know. I'm really excited about it. I think it's better than a concert or a food festival. When should we have the festival?

Oliver: Maybe in July?

Emily: I'm not sure. A lot of people are on holiday in July. I think August or September is a better idea; September is probably better because it gives us more time to plan.

Oliver: OK, let's do it as you said. Now what do we need to organize?

Emily: First, let's think about the place. Why don't we have the festival in the cinema or the museum in the city center?

Oliver: I think the park is a better idea than both of these.

Emily: Really? Why?

Oliver: Well, it's nicer to be outside and the weather is often sunny in September, but it's not too hot and it doesn't rain much. Organizing a film festival in the cinema is not creative enough and there is not enough space for people in the museum. In the museum, people cannot move easily.

Emily: OK, let's have the festival in the park.

Oliver: And how do we tell people about it?

Emily: Shall we make a website? Or maybe we should make some posters or a radio advertisement? What do you think?

Oliver: I'd prefer to make posters. They are cheap to prepare, and everybody can see them on walls.

Emily: I agree with you. I think you should make the posters because you're good at art. I'm terrible at drawing and designing. And I know the manager of the park. I will call him to ask if we can use the park for the festival.

Oliver: OK, great. You should call him.

Emily: There are some other things we need to do, like choosing the films.

Oliver: Mmm. Maybe we should choose them together. You can make a list and I'll make a list then we can meet and decide.

Emily: Good idea.

Oliver: We also have to print and sell the tickets. Maybe I could do that as well as making the posters?

Emily: That's a good idea. You can print the tickets. That just leaves selling tickets to people. How much should each ticket be?

Oliver: Well.. What about \$20 for adults and \$15 for students?

Emily: What about children? Will it be free for them?

Oliver: Well...I think it can cost only \$5 for the children under the age of 10. What do you think?

Emily: It sounds nice. Finally, how can we sell the tickets?

Oliver: Well, we need to sell as many tickets as possible. I can try to sell tickets at work and to my family and friends.

Emily: And I can tell everyone at college and people I know on social media.

Oliver: Me too. That's a great idea. Let's come together next week to talk about our progress.

Emily: Ok then, see you next week.
