<b>Course Content and Objectives</b>	In this course, students will be introduced to the basic concepts, theories, and analytical methods of political science. The course focuses mainly on state, political power, legitimacy, democracy, authoritarianism, and totalitarianism in addition to the functioning of democratic systems through topics such as political participation, political parties, pressure groups, public opinion, media, and elections. By the end of the course, students are expected to gain the ability to think critically about political phenomena, understand the theoretical foundations of politics, and analyze contemporary political issues through multiple perspectives.

<b>Teaching Methods and Techniques</b>	The course will be conducted through lectures, class discussions, and question–answer sessions. Students are expected to complete assigned readings and actively participate in discussions. Homework and short written reflections will be used to reinforce understanding.
